MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

In reflection on 2023, WOW is all I can say! The Rosendin Foundation's staff and volunteers not only met but exceeded all expectations. We carried out our mission to positively impact our community, build and empower people, and inspire innovation in amazing new ways by implementing programming and growing our service days and grant-giving. I am so proud of our community-building efforts because by coming together, we used the power of the collective to advance our industry to new heights. We fully lived our core values of We Care, We Share, We Listen, We Excel, We Innovate, and We are Thankful.

We launched our inaugural TRF Camp Build in 2023. This innovative, thoughtful program provided transformative results. We saw middle schoolers become safe builders by building their confidence, knowledge, skills, and ability to handle tools and problem-solve. In a mere week, our campers learned and grew in ways we did not anticipate. Launching TRF Camp Build in five cities was a huge undertaking, but the staff and committee members demonstrated they were up to the task. We received tremendous praise, especially for our volunteers and their professionalism in conducting the weeklong and one-day camps.

TRF Camp Build could not have succeeded without our committee members, who worked so hard; our sponsors, who invested in developing future construction leaders; and our volunteers, who shared their time, talents, and stories with the campers. My deepest gratitude goes out to everyone involved.

Others in the industry took notice of our co-ed hands-on TRF Camp Build and appreciated The Rosendin Foundation taking the lead in exposing young students to construction and learning how to build together safely. When these campers are of age to enter the workforce, they expect a different industry where women account for a significantly higher percentage of the industry than where we are now. TRF Camp Build is how we demonstrate that construction is for everyone and introduce innovations. In 2024, The Rosendin Foundation is adding a 2nd Year to the TRF Camp Build curriculum where campers can continue to build on their knowledge and skills through more advanced projects and lessons. I anxiously await the launch of these 2nd year camps to see how our campers have continued to build on their fundamentals and see their growth over the past year. As always, we will share videos and photos on The Rosendin Foundation's social media channels for all to see.

In 2023, the The Rosendin Foundation staff listened a lot. We listened to our volunteers, the broader donor base, and the Rosendin Holdings employee pool, which helped us target and expand our impact through our grant-giving and service days. The Rosendin Foundation's Communications Committee, under the leadership of Alec Overn, planned and organized 31 Service Days with 493 volunteers sharing their time and talents with our community partners, equating to 2,683 hours positively impacting our communities. We also had 166 first-time volunteers! One of our goals for 2024 is to increase that number and do even more in our communities. Since TRF launched in 2020, our volunteers have collectively spent 4,068 hours giving back, and together, we are continuing to build a community based on caring for one another.

In our third year as Rosendin Holdings, Inc.'s nonprofit charitable arm, The Rosendin Foundation distributed \$640,000 to 81 nonprofit community partners, including 44 new partners, leading to a 15% increase over 2022. The Grant Making Committee, led by Joan Bremer, listened to our local communities and employees to allocate the grant dollars where needed and create customized grants for each geographic area. Since 2020, The Rosendin Foundation has distributed \$1,880,350 in grants to 220 unique nonprofit organizations across the U.S.

The Rosendin Foundation's Fundraising Committee, under the leadership of Ray Nelson, demonstrated how we excel. The 2nd Annual TRF Golf Tournament and Fundraiser sold out all foursomes within 1.5 months of launching and achieved an 18% increase in funds raised over 2022. On behalf of The Rosendin Foundation, we are incredibly thankful to our Champion Annual Sponsor, Milwaukee Tool, and our tournament presenting sponsors, Border States and Sunbelt Rentals. Our industry partners show how they value supporting our community by investing in our work. To date, we have raised \$1,071,475.80 outside Rosendin Holding's patronage.

We would also like to send a special thank you to our 135 sustaining monthly donors. To make monthly donations easy for Rosendin and MPS employees, Fred Meeske and Jad Chalhoub's technology team developed a new dynamic intranet form allowing contributions from each paycheck rather than once a month. In 2024, we anticipate exceeding \$100,000 in employee contributions for the first time. What makes this even more exciting is that Rosendin Holdings will match up to \$500,000 for every dollar employees donate to The Rosendin Foundation. If you are a Rosendin or MPS employee

In 2023, our Finance Committee, led by Matt Van Fossen, helped us negotiate a new allocation agreement with Rosendin Holdings. We also welcomed new members to this committee to help ensure transparency with our funding.

Finally, we hope you enjoy our monthly newsletters, social media posts, and YouTube videos. It is important for us to share, engage, and educate our supporters about the issues that our communities face. Thank you for accepting our invitation to participate and helping our communities thrive. Please continue to share your feedback and ideas because it is only through active participation that we continue to evolve, improve, and execute our mission.



Finance Committee



They ensured our records were complete and accurate, created the annual budget, and worked with the President to ensure it aligned with the Foundation's strategic goals.

Fundraising Committee

The Fundraising Committee stayed busy planning and executing The Rosendin Foundation's 2nd Annual TRF Golf Tournament & Auction with the support of volunteers. The event sold out in 1.5 months and resulted in a net surplus of \$231K raised to support The Rosendin Foundation to carry out its mission (see page 11).
